UNDIP SHINES AT THE 38TH PIMNAS, BRINGING HOME 14 MEDALS AND SECURING 4TH PLACE

UNDIP, Makassar (November 28, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) achieved remarkable success at the 38th National Student Scientific Week (PIMNAS) hosted by Hasanuddin University. UNDIP surged from last year's 27th position to 4th place in 2025, securing a total of 14 medals. The achievement includes 3 gold, 1 silver, and 3 bronze medals in the Poster category, as well as 1 gold, 4 silver, and 2 bronze medals in the Presentation category.

The awards were officially announced during the closing ceremony at the JK Arenatorium Hall in Makassar on Wednesday, 27 November 2025. Team Chitoma delivered the highest achievement with two gold medals, followed by Team Satis and Team S-DIDES, who strengthened UNDIP's performance with additional gold and silver medals. Further contributions from Teams Tioxene, Quathemica, Tridaxdots, Geowave, and Courcide brought UNDIP's total medal count to 14.

UNDIP Rector Prof. Suharnomo expressed his pride in this exceptional accomplishment. "This achievement is truly extraordinary. UNDIP has risen from 27th to 4th place, showing that our student development strategies and mentoring efforts have been highly effective," he said. He emphasized that this success reflects the dedication of the students and their faculty advisors.

Vice Rector for Academic and Student Affairs, Prof. Heru Susanto, also conveyed his deep appreciation for the efforts of all teams. "There are no words except grateful, grateful, and grateful. Results will never betray effort. This is not the end but a momentum for us to be better tomorrow than today," he stated, highlighting the importance of sustained perseverance among students.

Prof. Heru further stressed that this success was a collective achievement involving students, supervisors, and the UNDIP PKM Task Force. UNDIP SECURES DOUBLE PODIUM AT PLN ICE 2025: INNOVATIVE MICROCAR EV BY TEAM KERIS DIPONEGORO

UNDIP, Surabaya (November 25, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) achieved another remarkable milestone through its participation in the PLN Innovation & Competition in Electricity (ICE) 2025, held at ITS Surabaya on 21-23 November 2025. The Keris Diponegoro Team from the Faculty of Engineering claimed 1st Place in the Race subcategory and 2nd Place in the Engineering Design subcategory for the Rally Micro EV Car competition. This achievement underscores UNDIP's strong commitment to advancing competitive electric vehicle innovations.

PLN ICE is an innovation competition organized by PT PLN (Persero) to encourage the development of ideas and prototypes of electric vehicles and energy-based products. Among 47 finalist teams from 18 leading Indonesian universities, Keris Diponegoro was the only representative from UNDIP to reach the final round. In this event, the team introduced MUV (Micro Utility Vehicle), a compact microcar EV designed with a focus on efficiency, utility, and safety.

The development of the MUV prototype was completed over three intensive months by five UNDIP students, covering design, frame fabrication, and performance testing, with funding support from PLN's Research and Development Center and mentorship from Prof. Ir. Sulistyo, M.T., Ph.D. Team leader Alda Mahira emphasized the innovation's industrial potential. "The Micro Utility Vehicle we built has been proven safe and roadworthy. We hope this competition serves as a bridge for the downstreaming of student innovations into real industrial products," she said.

Team member Dhiyanudin Nabil expressed pride in securing two podium finishes in UNDIP's debut at the event. "We are very happy, emotional, and never expected that our efforts—from proposal to final race—would earn us two podiums. We are proud to represent UNDIP at PLN ICE 2025," he said. He added that several technical challenges were successfully overcome through strong teamwork and collaborative problem-solving.

With this achievement, the Keris Diponegoro Team hopes to continue competing in future events. "We hope to keep participating in competitions like this, and we look forward to joining more categories and achieving even better results at PLN ICE 2026," Nabil concluded. This accomplishment strengthens UNDIP's role in promoting clean energy innovation and advancing national electric vehicle technology.



THE ACHIEVEMENT OF AQSA AUFA SYAUQI, UNDIP MEDICAL STUDENT AND RECIPIENT OF THE 2025 DPD RI AWARDS

UNDIP, Jakarta (Oktober 31, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) reaffirmed its position as a leading research institution through the achievements of its medical student, Aqsa Aufa Syauqi S., who received the 2025 DPD RI Award for Social and Health Development. Presented by the Regional Representative Council of the Republic of Indonesia (DPD RI), the prestigious award honors young individuals contributing to national advancement through innovation, impactful research, and community empowerment.

The award ceremony took place at the Tribrata Hotel and Convention in South Jakarta on October 28, 2025, where recognitions were granted in five categories: Social and Health Development, Culture and Tourism, Child Protection and Women's Empowerment, Creative Economy, and Advocacy for Vulnerable Groups. Aqsa stood out as one of the youngest recipients among prominent national and regional figures.

Acknowledged as an innovative young leader, Aqsa combines scientific passion with social awareness. Through the Aqsa Center for Innovation and Research, he develops technology-based research aimed at improving public healthcare services. One of his innovations, Risk-Based Business Licensing, has been granted a patent by the Directorate General of Intellectual Property. His global contributions were further recognized when the International Federation of Inventors' Associations (IFIA) in Geneva awarded him the honorary title "Inv" (Inventor), later leading UNDIP to name him an Outstanding International Student.

Aqsa's commitment to research began in high school, including studies on bamboo that inspired the establishment of the "Mister Team" research group at UNDIP's Faculty of Medicine.

The team has grown into a hub for herbal-based studies addressing skin diseases, cancer, and infections. He is currently pursuing UNDIP's combined MD and Master of Biomedical Science programs, embodying the spirit of Impactful Science and Technology (Diktisaintek Berdampak) that integrates research, innovation, and community engagement.

After receiving the award, Aqsa expressed deep gratitude and emphasized the moral significance behind the recognition. "Alhamdulillah, I am very grateful and honored to receive the 2025 DPD RI Award. For me, this award is not only a form of appreciation but also a mandate and responsibility to create and contribute to society. I believe that great change always begins with small steps," he said. THREE UNDIP RESEARCHERS WIN THE 2025 JAWA TENGAH DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH AWARD

UNDIP, Semarang (November 6, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) has once again demonstrated its academic excellence as three of its researchers were named recipients of the 2025 Jawa Tengah Development Research Award, organized by the Regional Research and Innovation Agency (BRIDA) of Central Java Province on November 6, 2025. The award recognizes individual researchers, research groups, and industry practitioners who produce outstanding and relevant research addressing regional development issues.

The awardees from UNDIP are Dr. Fitriyono Agustaningwarno, whose study focuses on mineral composition in non-centrifugal cane sugar; Prof. Widayat, with research on halal certification to support food security in Central Java; and Sigit Febrianto, whose work utilizes machine learning for mangrove species mapping. They successfully passed a rigorous selection process from dozens of research submissions across various institutions.

According to BRIDA, only twelve finalists were selected after going through verification, technical evaluation, presentations, and interviews with the judging panel. This recognition highlights UNDIP's continued commitment to producing research that not only excels academically but also contributes significantly to regional development. "This accomplishment shows how UNDIP's research can bridge academia and public policy through an evidence-based approach," stated a BRIDA representative during the ceremony.

The 2025 award adopted five strategic themes, including governance, competitive economic growth, inclusive and sustainable regional development, socio-cultural progress, and advancements in education and employment.

Eligible research works were scientific publications released between 2022 and 2025, focusing on Central Java. Awardees are also required to prepare a Policy Brief alongside BRIDA as a direct contribution to local policymaking.

Through this achievement, UNDIP reaffirms its role as a research-driven institution committed to enhancing societal well-being. The innovative work of its researchers strengthens UNDIP's contribution to sustainable, inclusive, and competitive regional development, in alignment with the university's vision of being "Noble and Valuable."



UNDIP RECEIVES AWARD FROM THE MINISTRY OF IMMIGRATION AND CORRECTIONS FOR ITS CONTRIBUTION AND COLLABORATION IN THE CENTER IMMIGRATION POINT SERVICE

UNDIP, Semarang (November 19, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) received an award from the Ministry of Immigration and Corrections (Kemenimipas) for its contribution and collaboration in establishing the Center Immigration Point at UNDIP. The award was presented during the First Anniversary Thanksgiving Ceremony of Kemenimipas on Wednesday, November 19, 2025, at the Punokawan Hall of the Class I Special Immigration Office in Semarang. This recognition reflects UNDIP's significant role in supporting the enhancement of public services in the immigration sector.

In his remarks, the Head of the Regional Office of the Directorate General of Corrections for Central Java, Mardi Santoso, delivered the message of the Minister of Immigration and Corrections, General (Ret.) Agus Andrianto. "The Ministry of Immigration and Corrections cannot operate independently—collaboration and synergy are essential to achieving broader national development goals," he said. UNDIP was acknowledged as one of the key partners that has contributed meaningfully to Kemenimipas' public service mission.

The award was handed over directly by Mardi Santoso, accompanied by the Head of the Class I Special Immigration Office, Haryono Agus Setiawan. With the establishment of the Center Immigration Point, UNDIP becomes one of only two universities in Indonesia to offer official passport services on campus. The facility will begin operating next Monday to serve the academic community, university staff, international students, and the general public.

"We are grateful for the collaboration we have established with the Ministry of Immigration and Corrections. God willing, starting next Monday, the Immigration Point service will officially open at UNDIP," he stated. The service, located at the first floor of Muladi Dome, will provide passport issuance, residency permits, and immigration education.

In addition to immigration services, UNDIP also maintains strategic cooperation with the Directorate General of Corrections, particularly through academic units such as the Faculty of Animal and Agricultural Sciences. This includes land utilization and rehabilitation programs for inmates. Prof. Suharnomo emphasized that such collaborations give UNDIP an opportunity to contribute directly to community development. The award is expected to strengthen future cooperation between UNDIP and Kemenimipas in delivering impactful public service innovations.

INDONESIAN COORDINATING MINISTER FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS OPENS THE 11TH IAKMI 2025, ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC FORUM HELD AT UNDIP'S FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH

UNDIP, Semarang (November 1, 2025) — The Indonesian Public Health Experts Association (IAKMI) held its 11th Annual Scientific Forum at the Faculty of Public Health, Diponegoro University (UNDIP), on Friday, October 31, 2025. Carrying the theme “The Role of Public Health Experts in Supporting Asta Cita: Strengthening Sustainable Promotive and Preventive Strategies Toward a Golden Indonesia,” the forum served as a collaborative platform to reinforce the contribution of public health experts in advancing Indonesia’s national development agenda.

The forum was officially opened by Indonesia’s Coordinating Minister for Human Development and Cultural Affairs, Prof. Pratikno, who highlighted food security and health as crucial components of Indonesia’s preparation for Golden Indonesia 2045. “To achieve this goal, the government has set eight national development agendas (Asta Cita), one of which focuses on improving the quality of human resources,” he stated.

Prof. Asnawi Abdullah, Chairman of AIPTKMI and Head of the Ministry of Health’s Health Development Policy Agency (BKPK), explained that the forum and the 21st IAKMI National Working Meeting were attended by 500 participants nationwide. “This forum is highly strategic, as IAKMI holds a major responsibility in preparing excellent human resources to support sustainable national development,” he said. He emphasized the need to strengthen promotive and preventive health systems to address infectious diseases, disparities in health access, and environmental and lifestyle-related challenges.

The Governor of Central Java, Ahmad Luthfi, expressed support for government priorities through regional programs such as Mobile Specialist Doctors (SPELING) and poverty reduction initiatives. With the theme “Beneficial Ownership: From Campus Business to Billion-Rupiah Enterprises,” the event addressed business regulations, integrity, transparency in beneficial ownership, and the risks of identity misuse in company establishment. Held at Muladi Dome on November 19, 2025, the program attracted more than 1,270 students both onsite and online.

Minister of Law, Dr. Supratman Andi Agtas, underscored the importance of accurate data submission when starting a business. “Filling in accurate information is crucial. We must list the correct and responsible individuals,” he stated. He emphasized that honesty is the most valuable capital in the business world. “If you are honest, any financial institution will come to you. Integrity is the first gateway to trust,” he added. Head of PPAK, Ivan Yustiavandana, warned that hidden ownership structures increase the risk of crimes such as corruption, narcotics distribution, tax evasion, and online gambling.

North Maluku Governor Sherly Tjoanda stressed that trust, reputation, and legal compliance form the foundation of successful business ventures. “Capital is not just money; it is your good name and reputation,” she said. She highlighted that transparency in legal documents and financial reports is essential to attracting investors. Sherly also emphasized that integrity and resilience are critical qualities in today’s workforce and encouraged students to expand their networks early.

UNDIP AND THE MINISTRY OF MSMEs STRENGTHEN CAMPUS ENTREPRENEURSHIP ECOSYSTEM, PREPARING INDONESIA'S FUTURE MICROPRENEURS

UNDIP, Semarang (November 21, 2025) — Diponegoro University (UNDIP) held a Public Lecture and MSME Expo with Indonesia's Minister of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises, Maman Abdurrahman, at the Entrepreneurship Hall of the Faculty of Economics and Business. The event, themed "Building a Creative, Adaptive, and Competitive Micropreneur Generation," underscored UNDIP's commitment to developing young entrepreneurs and accelerating innovation downstream toward Golden Indonesia 2045. More than 500 students participated in the program.

The event opened with a report by the Deputy for Micro Enterprises, Muhammad Riza Adha Damanik, who highlighted the importance of fostering future MSMEs driven by innovation and technology. He emphasized that UNDIP students' innovations hold significant potential for strengthening national MSMEs. "Students must shift from being job seekers to becoming job creators," he stated. UNDIP Rector Prof. Soeharnomo reaffirmed the university's commitment to strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem through innovation and structured business mentoring.

Prof. Soeharnomo noted that UNDIP produces 10-15 new MSMEs annually, some of which have entered export markets with turnovers reaching Rp 1 billion. He stressed the importance of downstream innovation, stating, "If only ten percent of campus innovations reach the market, universities can demonstrate how research drives entrepreneurship." This year, UNDIP is also the second-largest patent applicant in Indonesia.

In his public lecture, Minister Maman Abdurrahman emphasized that being a university student marks the beginning of lifelong learning and opportunity building. "Being a student is not the final goal—it is the gateway to shaping character, building networks, and developing an entrepreneurial mindset," he said. With an estimated 14 percent of jobs disappearing by 2030 due to automation, he urged students to become job creators rather than job seekers.

The event's highlight included the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between UNDIP and the Ministry of MSMEs to strengthen collaboration in education, research, and community service related to entrepreneurship development. UNDIP also inaugurated the Diponegoro Usadaya Preneur entrepreneurship development center as a hub for innovation, collaboration, and MSME empowerment. The Minister later reviewed 18 selected student MSMEs considered promising for industrial scaling. This initiative strengthens UNDIP's role in producing innovative, globally competitive young entrepreneurs.
